Entry Fees:

Entries will be accepted until the draw date, please send one entry per dog running the trial. Make all fees payable to the FVRTC in Canadian funds only.

Dogs not registered in Canada must obtain a TCN before submitting an entry for a field trial. TCN's can be obtained from the CKC online, by paper application, or by contacting the Shows & Trials division toll free at 1-855-364-7252. A TCN fee of \$10.50 must be included with your entry for the trial. CKC registration or ERN must be applied for within 30 days of the trial or all wins and awards will be cancelled. Refunds must be requested in writing and must be accompanied by a veterinarian's certificate.

Please note the new CKC ruling: Canadian Resident non-CKC members running a wholly owned dog cannot win a placement unless they pay a non-member participation fee or a membership fee to the CKC. These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members.

Starting dogs in the major stakes to be determined by the TSX closing on Wednesday, Sept 23rd, 2020 and will be based on the running order posted prior to commencement of the trial. A system of rotation will be used for the start of subsequent series in the all-age stakes. A system of rotation may be used in the minor stakes.

- Dead ducks will be used in this trial.
- Males and females will be run in order of the draw.
- Wingers may be used in all stakes.
- Female dogs will not be vetted and handlers are reminded that bitches in estrus cannot compete in a CKC Licensed Trial.
- Eliminated dogs may be allowed to run out of contention in the minor stakes as time allows.
- Junior & Qualifying stakes may be combined. Therefore, dogs can only be entered in one minor stake.

Retriever Field Trial Rules & Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club State In:

Section 21.7, Page 75

"It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules, is not subject to any indignities of any kind. The Retriever Field Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred."

Section 3.3.2, Page 8

"Judges shall have the authority to disqualify any dog which does not appear within 15 minutes of the time designated for its turn to be tried."

Release and Indemnification

By participating in these trials (as handler, spectator or in any other role) each participant agrees to assume all risk and hazards incidental to these trials and agrees to release and to save harmless and indemnify the British Columbia Labrador Retriever Club Society and its members, any volunteer and the owners of the property upon which the tests are held together with their officers, agents, employees and representatives from all claims, actions, cost expenses and demands in respect to death, injury, loss or damage to the person or property of the participant howsoever caused, arising out of or in connection with the participants use or entry upon the property. It is understood that this agreement is binding upon the participants, his or her heirs, executors and assigns.

Please read the following guidelines which have been established to promote health and safety of everyone during this pandemic.

It is assumed that sending in your entry means you accept and will abide by all Provincial recommendations dealing with COVID- 19.

1. Club officials and participants are required to follow all guidelines that apply.
2. Practice social distancing. Avoid congregating to the extent possible. Gallery must practice social distancing – 6 feet between chairs. Be mindful when speaking to others.
3. Avoid shaking hands or hugging.
4. Avoid touching dogs or equipment that is not yours or your responsibility.
5. Park with sufficient distance between vehicles.
6. Remain near your vehicle until just prior to running and follow marshal's instructions regarding running order and entering holding blinds.
7. Any special instructions from the judges will be posted in the last holding blind.
8. Handlers will be invited to the line in small groups. You may not see the test dog run but will see other dogs run from the holding blinds.
9. Gloves should be worn by handlers.
10. Birds will be placed in a pail by the handler and dealt with by the marshal when the handler and dog leave the line.
11. Avoid putting leashes or jackets on holding blinds to avoid cross contamination.
11. Hand sanitizer will be available, please use it.
12. Bring your own food and drinks. No lunches or snacks will be provided.
13. Remove all your garbage from the grounds. There will be no garbage bins available.
14. There will sanitizer spray and paper towel outside the washroom – please ensure you sanitize surfaces after using the washroom.
