WE WILL UTILIZE THE 2 ENDING DIGITS IN THE TSX AS OF CLOSE OF BUSINESS ON TUESDAY JULY 27th AS A STARTING NUMBER FOR THE FIRST SERIES IN THE ALL AGE STAKES. JUDGES WILL IMPOSE A SYSTEM OF ROTATION THEREAFTER IN THE ALL AGE STAKES.

Entries will close at the draw party, Thursday July 22nd, 7:30 p.m. at the Simson farm, 2 Firehall Lane, Parkinson, Ontario. Entries may not be accepted, altered, cancelled or substituted after the official closing date. ENTRIES MUST BE PAID PRIOR TO THE CLOSING DATE OR THEY WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED, NO EXCEPTIONS.

Scratches prior to the draw are to be made to the Field Trial Secretary. For refunds after the draw, please refer to page 15, section 6.3 of the rule book. A \$15.00 surcharge may apply.

LISTING FEE: A listing fee of \$9.30 per dog per stake must accompany the entry of a dog for which a CKC individual registration number or ERN is not shown on the entry form.

GAME BIRDS: Ducks or Pheasants may be used in all stakes.

PRIZES: CKC rosettes will be awarded to all dogs who place or are awarded a C.M.

HEADQUARTERS: Will be located at Simson Farm, 2 Firehall Lane, Parkinson Township Ontario. Test sites will be well signed from major intersections in the area as well as from headquarters.

THERE WILL NOT BE FOOD AVAILABLE AT THIS TRIAL, THERE ARE LIMITED RESTAURANTS IN IRON BRIDGE, PLEASE COME PREPARED.

Notice to Trialers: Rule 21.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Retriever Field Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

DIRECTIONS TO HEADQUARTERS: From Hwy 17 in Iron Bridge, take Hwy 546 North approx. 10 km, Firehall lane will be on your right at the curve, we are the first drive on the left. Signs will be up from the intersection of Hwy 17 & Hwy 546.

ATTENTION: Please read and familiarize yourself with the following COVID-19 guidelines. Northern Ontario retriever Association will assume that by submitting your entry that you accept and will abide by all Ontario Provincial recommendations with regards to COVID-19. These guidelines may be amended or altered by the club as required. 1. Club officials and participants are required to follow all guidelines that apply. 2. Practice social distancing. Avoid congregating in groups as much as possible. Gallery must practice social distancing - 6 feet between chairs. 3. Avoid shaking hands and hugging. 4. Avoid touching dogs or equipment that does not belong to you or is not your responsibility. 5. Park with sufficient distance between vehicles. 6. Follow the marshals instructions regarding running order and entering holding blinds. 7. Any special instructions from the judges will be posted in the holding blind. 8. Handlers will be invited to the line in small groups. You might not see the test dog run but will have the opportunity to see other dogs run from the holding blinds. 9. Gloves must be worn by handlers 10. Birds will be placed into a bucket or onto bird rack by the handler and dealt with by the marshal once the dog and handler leave the line. Follow the instructions from the marshal. 11. Hand sanitizer will be available. 12. Have fun, stay safe.
