**GROUND**

The trial grounds are located about 35km (22 miles) SE of Saskatoon. See map.

There WILL NOT be a lunch wagon, so bring your own food and drink.

**Note: Electrical Sites are 15 amp outlets, cannot handle heaters or air conditioners**

3. Entries **CLOSE Monday, June 21, 2021**

4. DRAW will take place at 8:00 a.m. Tuesday, June 22nd at the home of the Field Trial Secretary.

All dogs will run in the order drawn.

5. The starting dog number in the first series of the Open on Saturday and Sunday will be determined by using the last two digits (including digits, if any, to the right of the decimal point) at closing of the Toronto Stock Exchange (TSE) S&P/TSX composite index on the Thursday immediately preceding the trial.

6. **A separate entry form for EACH dog in EACH stake is required (Official CKC Entry Form)**

7. All entries must be accompanied by the entry fee (and listing fee if applicable). The listing fee of **\$10.50 (GST included) per dog per event** is payable unless the entered dog has a CKC individual registration number or an ERN number.

Standard CKC rosettes to all dogs placing in each stake.

Certificate of Merit awards at the Judges' discretion

**A system of rotation will be used in the All Age Stakes**

**A winger may be used in all stakes**

8. Award system: First: 5 pts, Second: 3pts. Third: 2 pts. Fourth: 1 pt.

**SCRATCHES**

Approved scratches will forfeit \$10 per entry. No show refunds must be requested in writing to the FT Secretary within 14 days of the trial event.

**NOTE: New Non-member participation fee**

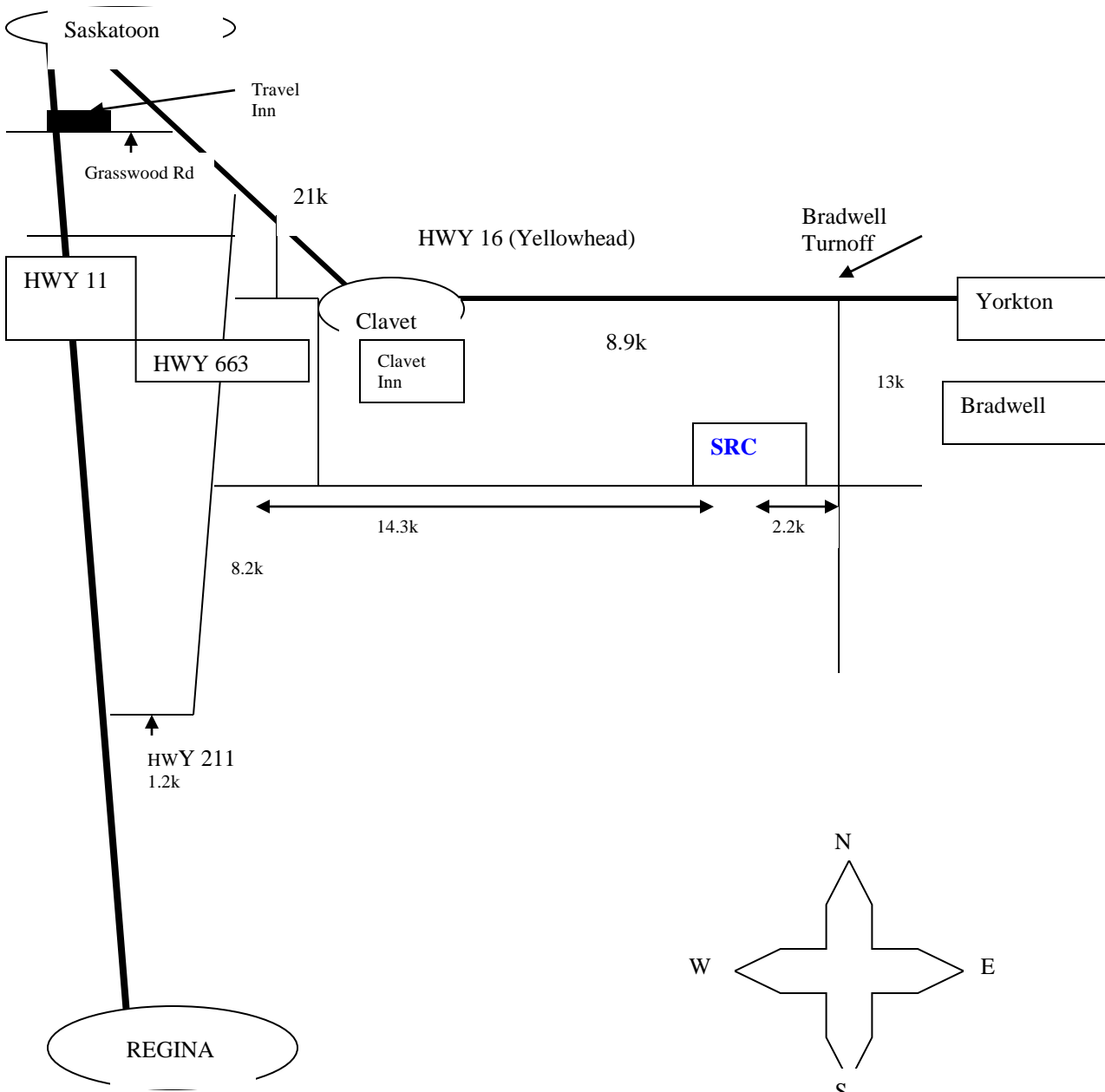
a)Beginning in 2011, an annual non-member participation fee for awards (placings) and titles will be charged to all Canadian residents who participate in a CKC event but are not CKC members. The fee will match the ERN fee.

b)In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards (points) and titles to be cancelled.

Once cancelled the awards, legs, points or titles will be given to the next applicable dog.

c)These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member.

## **COVID REGULATIONS: SASKATOON RETRIEVER CLUB EVENTS**

**For the safety of everyone involved, the Saskatoon Retriever Club requires that all adult participants and spectators must have received at least one vaccination against Covid-19 before attending our events.**

***Officials and participants are required to follow local and provincial Covid regulations.***

1. Practice physical distancing, maintaining 6 feet/2 meters between individuals whenever possible.
2. Judges will sit 6 feet/ 2 meters apart during judging and will complete their deliberations outside whenever possible. If there is inclement weather judges can complete deliberations inside a truck but should wear masks unless they are from a single household. Judges should bring their own pencils, judging books and rulebooks for use during the event. They should also bring masks if they wish to wear them. Hand sanitizer will be provided by the club. Judges chairs provided by the club will be sanitized whenever they are moved to a new judging location.
3. Marshalls will take birds from handlers for the judges during the tests, wearing gloves that will be sanitized between dogs and changed at least between series. In some events handlers may be asked to show their bird to the judges and then deposit it in a pail next to the line, without involving the marshall.
4. Judges, marshalls, and competitors in holding blinds should maintain a safe distance (>12 feet/4 meters) from each other and from the handler on the line because blowing a whistle or duck call has the potential to project a vapor. These individuals in close proximity to the handler should consider wearing masks for their own protection.
5. A maximum of 15 handlers will be allowed behind the line at one time to watch the test dog and see the throws from the line. Judges will direct that throws will be made or blinds planted to allow each set of 15 handlers to see the test, but only the handlers of the first 15 dogs to run will be on line to watch the test dog run.
6. Special instructions from judges will be posted in the holding blind.
7. When an honour is part of a test, the honouring dog and handler will be positioned at least 12 feet/4 meters from the running dog and handler.
8. Realizing that trials are an opportunity to see friends that you may not have seen in a long time due to COVID, it is very important to refrain from hugging or shaking hands or other close contact with individuals not in your household. Maintain physical distancing.
9. Competitors and spectators will be allowed to gather in a specified area (gallery) to watch the tests remaining seated in their own chairs, and maintaining > 6 feet/2 meters physical distancing between household groups. Masks are encouraged. Individuals can drink but should not eat while in the gallery – they should return to their campers or vehicles when eating.
10. Judges and throwers will each be given a bag lunch and drinks. All other workers and marshals should provide their own lunch and should maintain adequate distance from others while eating.
11. Throwers will have one sanitized chair with their name on it provided by the club that they will use for each series. They will also be provided with disposable gloves and with hand sanitizer that they should use frequently, at least once between each series. If an ATV is used it should be sanitized after each use. Throwers should not congregate between tests, and should maintain physical distancing.
12. In events where a carry gun is used (ie Hunt tests) the gun will be wiped with disinfectant wipes between competitors.

13. Everyone (officials, competitors and spectators) entering the trial location must on the first day they attend the trial complete a COVID-19 self declaration form (or drop one off that they filled in online) indicating that (a) they have not tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 14 days, (b) they are not awaiting the result of a COVID-19 test, (c) they have not had any symptoms consistent with COVID-19 infection in the past 14 days, (d) they have not been exposed to anyone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 in the past 14 days. If any of these statements are not true then they will be denied access to the property, as will anyone travelling with them. There will be an individual from the Club assigned to collect the signed declarations. The declarations will also have cell phone numbers so that contact tracing can occur if necessary.

14. If in the 14 days after attending the trial an individual develops symptoms and/or a positive test for COVID-19 they should let the Club know so that contact tracing can occur.

15. The event secretary will wear gloves while handling paperwork from the judges.

16. Awards will be announced outside, with physical distancing required. Ribbons can be picked up from the awards table – no hand shaking or hugging.

17. There will be no judge's dinner, tailgate meals or BBQ or group gathering for meals.

18. Access to the Clubhouse will be limited to a few Club workers who need to access the awards and paperwork and coolers. There will be no congregating indoors.

19. The outhouse doorknobs and toilet seats will be sanitized by a designated worker before the event and each day during the event. There will be hand sanitizer available in each outhouse. Disinfectant wipes will be in each outhouse and users will be asked to disinfect the doorknobs and toilet seats after each use.

20. Camping in the Campground area will be allowed. Visiting between campers is discouraged. Any socializing should be outdoors, and physical distancing maintained between household groups.
